Selection Criteria

- Why SPN's Associate Producer is the right internship for you.
- Excellent communication skills, including managing email.
- The ability to work both independently and as part of a hard-working team.
- Excellent time management skills and the ability to commit to a consistent weekly schedule.

Conditions

- This position is voluntary.
- You will need your own laptop.
- Associate Producers report to the Conference Manager.
- Time commitment is half a day a week, beginning the week of 1 August with potential extra time leading up to and during the Conference.
- Days and hours of work to be negotiated with the Conference Manager. Some work outside of these hours might be necessary, for example, to attend meetings and events.
- Most work will be at the Wheeler Centre, Melbourne CBD. Off-site work may also be needed.
