




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GRIFFITH REVIEW 66: THE LIGHT ASCENDING

The Light Ascending tells tales of explorations, redemptions and escapes – escapes from who we are, where we're from and what we know. The stories in this collection traverse continents. cultures and generations to illuminate new perspectives and new ways of seeing the world: a Javanese artist's model fights to survive in nineteenth-century Paris; a woman reckons with her past from deep within a coma; three performers try to carve a place for themselves in an insular town; a family faces a tragedy that threatens to tear them apart.

The Light Ascending features the 2019 winners of The Novella Project VII: Julienne van Loon, Mirandi Riwoe, Keren Heenan and Allanah Hunt. The winners of Griffith Review's seventh annual novella competition, supported by Copyright Agency's Cultural Fund, were chosen by expert judges Maxine Beneba Clarke, Aviva Tuffield and Holden Sheppard.

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

Vera Rudner is one of Australia's first and finest Surrealists, with paintings in the National Gallery of Australia. As she stopped painting early and her work is rare, it has not yet seen the recognition its power, vibrancy and craftsmanship deserve. This is the first book completely about her work.

Rudner explains that, for her, Surrealism is an internal process, stemming from the 'self'. In light of this, Quemar's study begins with a biographical section—her childhood as a silent film actress in Berlin, escape from Nazi Germany as an adolescent studying progressive art, arrival in Australia, and a sharp-focused exploration of Surrealism's possibilities.

There is then an essay on how Surrealism in Rudner's work remains distinct from Expressionism and other concepts of Surrealism, then approaches to six of her intact paintings, examining their deconstructed elements. The paintings are shown in colour, for the first time juxtaposing her private collection with her works owned by National Gallery of Australia.

Rudner's paintings navigate labyrinths—warzones, suburbia, abandonment, the emotions of familiar objects or objects unrecognised.

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Motherling

Not long ago, a grieving mother walked the ancient pilgrim pathways of the Camino de Santiago. She describes her extraordinary experiences of time and place, and makes keen observations of the lives and energy around her. In a moment of empowerment on behalf of all mothers, she invented a new and loving name for women who have lost a child.

Motherling captures the pain, loss and grief during the most tragic event imaginable for a parent. It is a tale of suffering and understanding. Jen's walk teaches her to accept that which cannot be changed, and adapt to a new world to mend a shattered heart

This memoir does not shy away from exploring grief, and the courage it takes to overcome it. Featured in The Australian Women's Weekly and Myf Warhurst, ABC Local Radio. *Motherling* will stay within the reader's heart forever.

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



















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PLAY WITH KNIVES: FIVE: GEORGE AND CLARE, THE MALACHITE AND THE DIAMONDS

Last novel in Jennifer Maiden's Play With Knives Quintet, George and Clare, the Malachite and the Diamonds experiments across poetry, prose, style, person, action. Clare was central character in what Oxford Companion to Australian Literature calls Maiden's 'impressive' first Play With Knives novel (1990). Set in Sydney's Western Suburbs, it centred on George and Clare, as she was released from prison. The Quintet outlines their growth.

In Mount Druitt, Clare and George, now human rights observers, are implored by a friend to rescue her daughter, Quentin—a young arms dealer who has been taken to Russia by her husband, a sinister telecommunications figure dealing in quantum diamonds, prized by national forces. Quentin is prized by Australian governments, for her contacts, skill in arms-selling. Political strategies surround the characters and affect them, from creation of the Russian war cabinet, to

Novichok, political isolation and survival, a Russian summer house with a Russian journalist, a member of Russian police, and a Saudi agent—Australian and Ukrainian mercenaries at the gate.

Something immediate can be internal or spiritual, an intrinsic explicit love scene, or space where Clare can survive, reassuring herself that her murders are not forgiven or compartmentalised.

Whether Russian winter light, or midnight Mount Druitt mall, this work experiments where aspects of reality or experience integrate between sense of self and overview, between action and ability to transcend it.

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















THE SUICIDE SEASON



The title Once She Had Escaped the Tower has two meanings: once a lady escaped an imprisoning tower resolutely; and the lady continued her actions after escape. In contrast to literature in which a female hero dies captive in a tower, and to works in which her escape signals the end of narrative, Quemar Press' new volume shows female protagonists' survival, and casts light on them as they continue.

Quemar's Modern English translations are juxtaposed with the early French texts. This volume also includes a subjective essay by the translator.

Aucassin and Nicolette is a Medieval French 'chantefable' (a song-fable) by an anonymous author, interconnecting prose and song, creating a courtly love story. Marie de France's *Gugemer* comes from traditional Breton. She is considered earliest female French poet, her work written 1160–1215.



The title *brookings: the noun* has different levels of significance: venturing into a brook's safe appearance when it will turn to a threatening river, and, in extension, a noun to signify the misuse of something politically safe and sure as a distraction to conceal something politically dangerous. The poems observe how political decisions are concealed by ideas of rescue, protection, safety.

Jennifer Maiden describes brookings: the noun as 'a collection to do with disarming (both as adjective and verb) deception which falsely identifies a target or cause of indignation ...'


On an otherworldly edge of Lake Geneva, Borges questions conservative manipulation of experimental literature; a safe-seeming animal sleeps to deceptive music; in a golden White House, President Trump and his mother decipher the words around them; in a constructed Nirvana, Princess Diana addresses veiled aspects of murder freely with Mother Teresa; watching Sydney Harbour, Eleanor Roosevelt and Hillary Clinton speak of safe appearances; Maiden's renowned characters Clare and George rescue a child from lethally deceptive White Helmets in Syria; in a 'luminous' Sydney

dust storm, Tanya Plibersek can speak with Jane Austen; the archetypal Critic can be an aspect of anyone he addresses; and the historical CIA policy of media influence, Operation Mockingbird, perches echoing soft and lyrical in the night.

Jennifer Maiden was born in Penrith, New South Wales, and has had thirty books published—twenty-four poetry collections and six novels. Among Jennifer Maiden's many awards are three Kenneth Slessor Prizes for Poetry, two C. J. Dennis Prizes for Poetry, the overall Victorian Prize for Literature, the Harri Jones Memorial Prize, the H.M.Butterly-F.Earle Hooper Award (University of Sydney), the Grenfell Henry Lawson Festival Prize, the FAW Christopher Brennan Award for lifetime achievement in poetry, two The Melbourne Age Poetry Book of the Year awards, the overall Melbourne Age Book of the Year and the ALS Gold Medal. 
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
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



















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


THE SEA & US




TURN LEFT AT VENUS



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

In an isolated coastal town south of Sydney, young Finch Taylor is captivated by the mysterious beauty April Speare and her pianist husband William when they move into a nearby beach house with a piano and a tragic secret. Finch soon begins a lifelong love affair with music, and with April. But as he and April follow the great migration south to Tasmania, and eventually to a warming Antarctica, they must decide whether to bring children into a world without a future.

Hauntingly beautiful, *The Warming* depicts a nomadic existence, where love and hope are the only means of enduring a world that has turned against humanity.
