




MUTE



A new voice in Australian fiction tells a story of trauma and the long shadow it casts over the lives of three unforgettable characters.



PELSAERT'S NIGHTMARE, A NOVEL

Gregory Warwick Hansen

'A man's life is larger and more complex than the representation of any one event, yet a single incident is enough to disfigure the past and contest the moment.'

In the antipodean winter of 1629, the Dutch East Indiaman *Batavia* was wrecked on the desolate cays of the Houtman Abrolhos, an island chain lying beyond the sea horizon of what is now Western Australia.

One year later her merchant commander, Francisco Pelsaert, lies dying in a mildewed room outside the walls of Batavia Castle (modern-day Jakarta), his corporate hopes in tatters, the stigma of shipwreck and bloody mutiny foreclosing on his legacy. With only a servant-carer and the occasional visitor to relieve his solitude, he passes the hours in haunted reflection on the people and events that have shaped his life.

From the Netherlands and its colonial outposts to Mogul India and the coastal wildernesses of the Great South Land, Pelsaert's tale is one of many parts and places, of exotic encounter and shrouded pleasure, to unnerving dreams and thwarted certainties. Ultimately, *Pelsaert's Nightmare* is a journey in the quest for redemption.

One of the most ambitious works of historical fiction to come out of Australia, the manuscript was shortlisted for the inaugural 2016 First Novel Prize in the United Kingdom and was a First Place Category Winner in the 2018 Chaucer Book Awards for Pre-1750s Historical Fiction.

If you've loved Hilary Mantel's historical fiction, *Pelsaert's Nightmare* is a novel with the measure of a story much closer to home.

THE ESPIONAGE ACT: NEW POEMS

Jennifer Maiden

The Espionage Act is the new poetry collection by the internationally renowned author Jennifer Maiden. With her characteristic powerful focus and crisp but sumptuous lyrical style, she analyses espionage in many senses—from the US 1917 Espionage Act to reflections on the Deep State, to tactical levels in conservative espionage, to its sexuality of fear, to covert promotion and funding of experimental art, to espionage as survival, and to espionage's reactions to primal digital technology. Maiden also describes the mind itself in its multifaceted acts of espionage.

Here, understanding espionage is a way of understanding power in domestic and global terms.

Characters across this sphere include Gore Vidal, Assange, Turing, Dorothy Wordsworth, Pollock, Whiteley, Márquez, Downer, Emma Goldman, Princess Diana, Pompeo, The Master of the Crossroads, Jeffrey Epstein, and Maiden's own Clare and George, the sometimes allegorical but always innocent little marsupial Brookings, George's CIA drinking buddy, the Indigenous ASIO agent Olivia, and the archetypal critic, who is an aspect of any person with whom he speaks.

Exploring espionage's psychological complexities and deceptions allows the poet to observe and dismantle annihilating concepts of espionage—whether they involve intelligence operations, institutional deceptions, intimidations or assassinations—with her own guile and profound passion.





ALL SHE RESOLVES TO RESCUE: MARIE DE FRANCE'S 'LANVAL' AND 'GUILDELUEC AND GUILLIADON' ('ELIDUC')

Considered the earliest female French poet, Marie de France based her late 12th-century Lais on traditional Breton Lais.

The title All She Resolves to Rescue has two senses. The female heroes discern all that needs to be rescued, but the rescues also affect all, connecting disparate worlds. Here, a sprite-like Lady tells the Knight Lanval that she could never appear visible before him again if he let anyone know of their affection, but when her existence and actual presence are the only things that can rescue him from the Court's corruption, she rides openly through the city, deciding to speak before the Court. With similar emancipatory energy. Guildeluec-the wife of the Knight Eliduc-decides to revive the Lady whom Eliduc loves, who was hidden to her until that day. This action reveals the two women to one another and links two societies and ontological universes that the Knight has keep closely compartmentalised. The female hero, deliberation and rescue are catalysts that connect powerful worlds kept secret from each other.


Here, the female hero's agency brings the narrative to benign resolution, by means of that same emancipatory energy.




DANCING WITH DECEPTION




THE REVOLUTIONARY'S COUSIN

Maiden observes: 'One purpose of the essay is to try to warn against microcosmic unwariness in a situation where overwhelming macrocosmic forces are at play ... My focus is on the wider causes of damage and the nature of power in art ... to respect what Pinter considered mandatory, to smash the mirror of the microcosm, to try to look at the macrocosm behind it.'
